


Mollington Matters Autumn 2018

On 11 November 2018 the United Kingdom and its friends overseas will mark the day 100 years ago when the guns fell silent at the end of the First World War.

Four years ago we remembered the start of WWI with an exhibition in the Village Hall remembering the men from this village who gave their lives and who still have relatives in the village.

To mark the centenary of the end of WWI nationally over 1000 pipers will greet the dawn; church bells will be rung half muffled before Remembrance Services and again at 12.30; beacons will be lit at 7.00pm across the country; and at 7.05pm church bells will be rung again celebrating the peace. Mollington will be part of this commemoration.

Armistice Day is always 11 November and this year it falls on a Sunday. The village will be taking part in the commemoration remembering those men and women who lost their lives both in that and subsequent conflicts, as well those that were injured and others affected by losses and injuries.

The Remembrance Day Service will be held in the Parish Church at 10.50am, the North Banbury Scout Group will be attending together with an open invitation to everybody else to attend.

The Parish Council and Village Hall Committee have been working together to make this a village event. A beacon has been purchased. We looked for one of the highest points in the village that would be accessible to everyone and so the beacon would be visible. Our thanks go to Darryl and Gail Jeffries for allowing us to use one of their fields for us to gather and light the beacon.

We would like to invite everyone in the village to the beacon lighting for 6.30pm with the beacon being lit at 7.00pm. There will be hot sausage rolls and mulled wine available. The church bells will ring out at 6.15pm to ring in the Peace.

Please join us at the Remembrance Day Service in the morning and at the Jeffries farm in the evening.

If anybody needs transport please contact John Summers or Bob Wadsworth and we will try to make arrangements.

Orchard Piece Play Area



The Parish Council would like to embark on an exciting proposal for Orchard Piece Play Area. The playground is in a bit of a sorry state and even with the support from residents to make running

repairs, the area is long overdue a refurbishment.

The Parish Council agreed at the last meeting on the 25th September that we could organise a working party which would be involved in the planning and design of the project as well as thinking about fund raising. Although we can apply to Big Lottery and Cherwell District Council, we will need to think about how we can make this area a safe and enjoyable place for the children and residents of Mollington.

We have been to see other villages playgrounds and there are some great examples
of outdoor gym and play equipment that we
think would be well received, however this
playground needs support from the village.
A few of you have already agreed to take
part in the working group and we thank you
for that. We are gathering feedback from
the children of the village, as they will be
the main users and they have given us some
good ideas. We hope to pull together some
help from Activate Learning Students in
Banbury who are studying health and fitness,
so their input will be appreciated.

We hope to make the area more accessible for buggies and bikes and to create an exciting play area for children with the addition of outdoor gym equipment for those who may be interested in fitness but not want to pay expensive gym fees.

Roads update

Oxfordshire County Council confirmed the following works would be carried out within the next 12 to 18 months:



- Chestnut Road repair/resurface
- Main Street repairs marked with yellow paint

Further potholes have been marked in Main Street and March Lane that are to be repaired within the next month. Roundhill Road is still to be confirmed.

Repairs may require partial or full road closures. We will keep you informed of these and the dates for the work to be carried. In the mean time keep posting road and other street problems on Fix My Street fixmystreet.oxfordshire.gov.uk

Emergency plan

We have a limited emergency plan in the village. The village hall could be used if an evacuation is required. However in the



case of a long power cut we would need to get a generator to the hall. To help this the Village Hall Committee is looking at a generator hook up and to tarmac an area where it could stand outside the village hall.

Capsules to keep important health information in have been ordered from Oxfordshire County Council and these will be available through Mollington Munch, the church and Bob Wadsworth or John Summers.

Residents may be able join the Priority Services Register with utility companies if they:

- are of pensionable age;
- are disabled or chronically sick;
- have a long-term medical condition;
- have a hearing or visual impairment or additional communication needs; or
- are in a vulnerable situation.

Dog Waste

Please pick it up and put it in one of the bins located on: Main Street opposite



the Green Man; Roundhill Road by the 30 MPH sign; March Lane by the Mollington sign; Orchard Piece by the playing field; and in the village hall car park.

If you see someone leaving waste at the side of the path or road please ask them to use the bins.

Failing to pick up waste can result in a £50 fine; while dumping waste by the side of the road or path (photo above) can result in a higher fine of £75.
