1219 Minutes of the meeting held 22nd July 2025 (previously circulated) and Matters arising. The minutes had been circulated in advance of the Meeting. It was agreed that there were no matters arising that were not covered elsewhere on the agenda.

1221 Consultations

There is still a vacancy for a Parish Councillor – details can be found on the website, or by contacting the Clerk or one of the present Councillors.

Barring no holdups in a LEVI (local electric vehicle infrastructure fund) procurement process that should be concluding shortly, OCC is hoping to open applications for those interested in an EV Microhub towards the later part of this year. Mollington has been added to the list of interested communities.

The EV Microhub offer will facilitate 100 community sites to access a 15-year concession contract with an appointed contractor. The concession contract will be for the installation of a double-socket chargepoint serving two designated EV-charging parking bays (converted within a car park) with energy supply intended to come from the existing power supply/fuse box.

MPC will need to consider any conflict regarding the site proposed, as it appears to be Parish Council land, but using the Village Hall electricity supply.

The next Parish Liaison Committee meeting will be held online, on Wednesday 12th November.

1223 Councillors Reports

Councillor Banister

The next edition of Mollington Matters is aiming be issued around the end of October / early November and is expected to include details of the councillor vacancy and elections in May 2026, and details of a village work party WhatsApp group.

Councillor John

It was reported that Thomas Fox continued the contracted grass cutting schedule. Steps being taken to review existing scope of the grass cutting contract with a revision and tendering process to start in the next 2 weeks and hoping for valid interested parties' quotations before end of November. The scope will be based on an initial 3 years with option for a further one year extension agreed between both parties.

Oxford Highways have started to fix the potholes on Main Street, March Road as well as Lower Farm Road. Whilst not a complete resurfacing it is seen as temporary works. Correspondence with Highways has identified the PC concerns on fixing the long overdue repairs to the water drainage issues which will impact the March Road repairs once we experience heavy rains and freezing conditions. There needs to a higher level of prioritisation to close this long outstanding problem.

On site meeting to be held this week (Thursday) with OCC Trees representative to review status and condition of trees in the village to ascertain any concerns on possible tree fall due to weather conditions, especially high winds which has been experienced in the past. Whilst there has been some monies set aside for such emergency work by the PC, there are concerns that OCC / CDC needs to take a more active part in tree management.

Village Hall activities included the regular munch, coffee mornings etc. Whilst efforts were made by the VH committee to arrange several events there are concerns that little support by the general public. The recent organised disco and cocktail evening had to be cancelled due to only 14 tickets being sold and the majority were to existing committee members. Following the recent Bank Holiday car boot sale, further events planned are Mollington History talk in Oct, Quiz night in Nov, Xmas Fayre in Dec plus the ongoing coffee and munch events. Posters of these events will be distributed throughout the village and on social media.

Councillor Gorman

A number of ideas for planters that could be sited at the entrances to the village were shown, and Councillor Gorman will investigate the best and most cost efficient ways of planting these and providing ongoing maintenance.

Following reports of recent drain and gulley clearance in June, the drains throughout the village will be inspected and remapped, to compare with CDC's report.

Councillor Sullivan

Councillor Sullivan reported that the step to the stile on the path to Shotteswell became rotten and collapsed. As the stile served no purpose, the horizontal bars have been removed. If the fence around the field is ever removed, we will need to re-instate the stile. Otherwise, there are no known issues with footpaths.

There have been reports of dog fouling on Church Lane; the dog warden is to be contacted for advice on how to manage this increasing problem.

In addition to village maintenance matters reported by fellow Councillors, given the continuing flow of water down the hill on Main Street going into March Road, we have arranged for Oxfordshire County Council a salt bin is to be sited there. The bin should be delivered by the Council in October and will be sited by the entrance to the allotments or on the edge of the Green.

Public Session

District Councillor Chris Brant reported that the planning application for the proposed solar farm at Hanwell was available to view on CDC's planning portal. A number of objections have already been lodged and although the closing date is soon, and MPC hasn't been consulted directly, MPC can still look at the application and respond.

He also advised that he would continue to put pressure on OCC to repair the leaking water pipes, which were noted in recent email, to be unlikely to be dealt with until the 2026/27 financial year. Blocked draind should be continued to be reported on FixMyStreet.
